

2016 A.E. Williams History Prize



The biennial AE Williams Prize is offered by the RWAHS with funds donated by the late Mr AE (Bert) Williams, augmented by his wife Ellen and Dr Alby Williams and Mrs Sue Williams, to promote interest in history.

A former Education Department headmaster, Bert Williams was a teacher and historian, and president of the Society. The \$1000 prize honours his contribution to WA history.

Eligibility

- RWAHS members and their direct descendants (any age)
- Members of Affiliated Societies

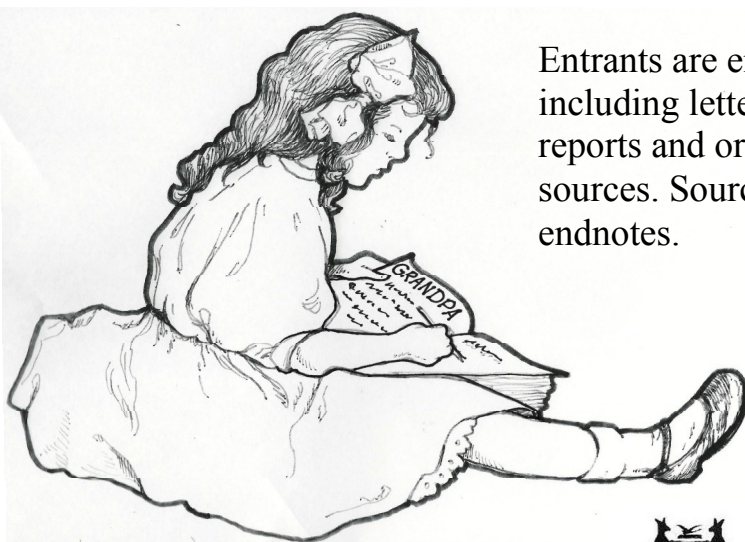
Ineligible

- Individuals earning money from writing or teaching history
- Any work previously published or submitted for publication

Subject A Profile of an Interesting Western Australian: Historical or Contemporary

Conditions

- Entries should be about 2000 words, typed and illustrated with maps, photos etc.
- Entries must include a Society cover sheet (available from Society).
- Entries must be with the RWAHS by **31 July 2016**.
- Entries may be submitted electronically.
- Winning entries will be retained in the Society Library.
- The judges' decision is final.



Entrants are encouraged to use a range of sources, including letters, diaries, newspapers, debates, original reports and oral histories, as well as secondary published sources. Sources should be acknowledged in numbered endnotes.

The \$1000 prize will be presented at the Society's AGM on 21 September 2016.
